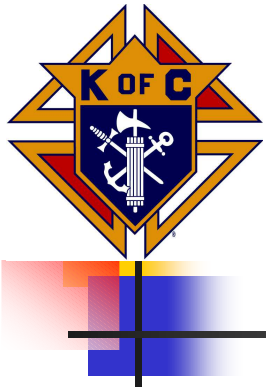


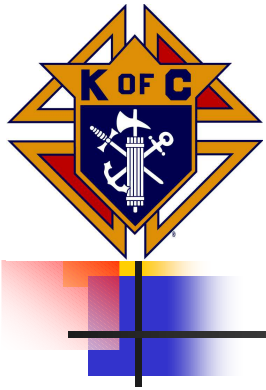

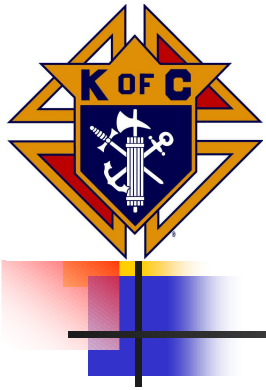
Eucharistic Adoration Part I Biblical Perspective

Eucharistic Adoration Part II Historical Perspective

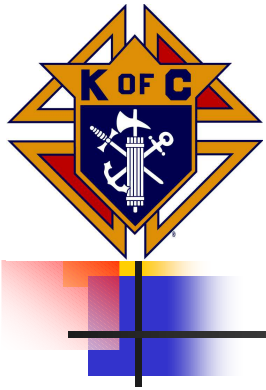
- St. Paul, St. John and the Evangelists
